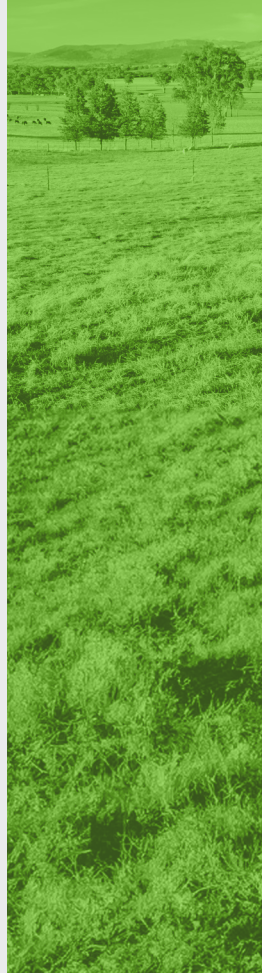
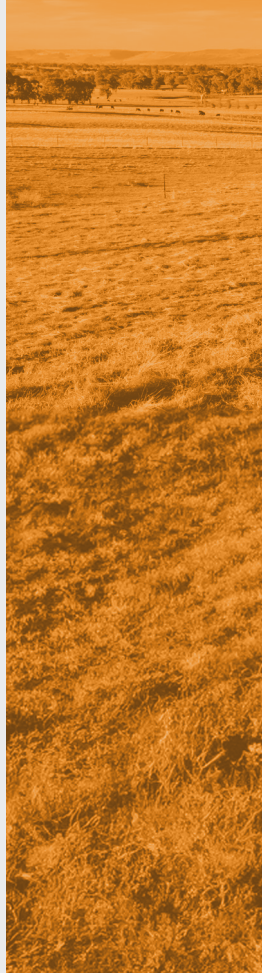
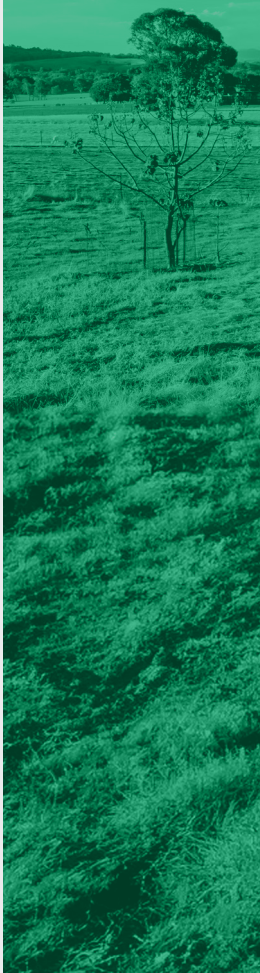

<p>Producer Demonstration Sites (PDS)</p> 	<p>What MLA's Producer Demonstration Sites (PDS) program aims to increase the rate of adoption of key management practices and technologies that improve business profitability, productivity and sustainability. This is achieved through supporting livestock producers working in peer-to-peer groups to pursue new skills, knowledge and management practices applicable to their own commercial livestock production systems.</p> <p>Nationally, MLA has over 90 PDS projects in progress across a broad range of topics.</p> <hr/> <p>Who it is for Producers with Livestock Advisors as facilitators</p> <hr/> <p>Benefits MLA offers funding to support the demonstration and extension of knowledge and skills related to a practice or commercially available technology identified to improve business performance.</p> <hr/> <p>Cost There are two funding options available to producer groups wishing to participate in the PDS program: Levy and Co-Contributor.</p> <p>Producer groups wishing to engage in a Levy PDS project can apply for up to \$30,000 a year for the length of the project.</p> <p>Groups wishing to engage in a Co-Contributor PDS project can apply for up to \$60,000 a year (plus access fee) for the length of the project.
